A time for research..... find out about possible future careers


A time for thinking...... about the future

When it comes to choosing a career you also need to find out as much information as possible in order to make an informed choice – we will look at areas of our Careers Service Website that can help with this later in the Presentation








Popular Careers

- Important: ICT Maths
- <u>Useful:</u> Art & Design, English, Media, Design Technology.
- YOU ALSO NEED AN ART PORTFOLIO








Computer Games Design





- Important: ICT, Maths, Physics
- Useful: Art & Design, Design Technology, English, Media, Music







Solicitor / Law



• Important: English, Maths

• Useful: History, RE

 A good spread of academic subjects







Teacher



• Important: Maths, English, Science

- Useful: many.
- If considering Post Primary Teaching make sure you keep on the subject you want to teach







Physiotherapist




- Important: Biology Double Award Science is required
- Useful: Chemistry, English, Physics, PE, Health & Social Care







Medicine / Doctor



- Important: You need to be very strong in your science and have the ability to take on Double Award Science or all the science subjects as separate GCSEs: Chemistry, Biology & Physics
- Useful: Chemistry, English, Physics, PE, Health & Social Care
- A good Spread of subjects 9 Best GCSEs







Engineering



Important: Physics & Maths
 / Further Maths, Chemistry

 Useful: English, Design Technology






PLEASE TAKE THE TIME TO GO ONTO THE WEBSITE AND READ ALL THE AREAS!
